Class of works: I am writing in support of Class #2 (DVD Region Coding):
Audiovisual works stored on Digital Versatile Disks ("DVDs") that are not
available in Region 1 DVD format and access to which is prevented by
technological measures.

Summary:

Disc name: Laputa, Spirited Away (both films distributed by Intercontinental
Video Limited)

While in Hong Kong, my sister came across several DVDs unavailable in the US -- several of Hayao Miyazaki's early Studio Ghibli works. Foolishly, she bought for me the official Disney-sanctioned DVDs instead of the cheaper, pirated, un-region-coded DVDs. (Intercontinental Video Limited claims on its web page to be Hong Kong's exclusive distributor of Disney content; the packaging also included a Mickey Mouse sticker on the front as well as a Copyright Buena Vista Home Entertainment notice, leading her to feel confident that she was indeed purchasing legitimate products.) When I tried to play them, however, I found that they were region-coded for Region 3, making them completely useless in an unmodified DVD player. I now have several legally-bought DVDs, with material unavailable in the US, produced by a US company, and they're utterly unplayable. The lesson is clear: Don't buy the official DVDs -- buy the quasi-legal, non-region-coded DVDs instead.
