- ▶ You may register your basic claim to copyright online. In addition, most of the information the Copyright Office makes available on paper can be viewed and downloaded from our website at www.copyright.gov. And, you may search online records of registrations and document recordings from 1978 forward on the Copyright Office website. See the list below for examples of what you may do online.



- ▶ To register a copyright online, go to **Electronic Copyright Office**. When you file your application online, you pay a lower fee, and your application will be processed quicker than if you file using a paper application. To obtain certain paper forms to register or renew a claim to copyright, go to **Forms**.
- ▶ To read, download, or print general information on copyright, click on **Copyright Basics**.
- ▶ To search the Copyright Office website, go to **Search Our Site**.
- ▶ To search the Office's online records, click on **Search Copyright Records**.
- ▶ To read, download, or print the copyright law, click on **Copyright Law**.
- ▶ To read questions and answers about copyright and the Copyright Office, click on **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)**.
- ▶ To find out what is going on in the Copyright Office, click on a selected topic under **Hot Topics** or **What's New**.
- ▶ To read historical documents relating to copyright, click on **Welcome**.

- ▶ Call the Forms and Publications Hotline at (202) 707-9100 to leave a recorded request for specific application forms and circulars. The items you request will be mailed to you.
