United States and Europe without purchasing multiple copies and multiple DVD
players. I live in both the U.S. and Europe. I have DVD players in three
homes, but cannot move my U.S. DVD's to my European home or vice versa due to
the zone restrictions encoded on such DVDs. For example, I love the films Jean
de Florette and Manon des Sources, DVD versions of which exist only in Europe.
I already own two copies of this production on VCR tape. I would like to play
these films from DVD in the U.S., but without buying a new pair of DVD players
I'm stuck. Also, I've already paid for this production twice and find buying
