#### ITEM C. OVERVIEW

The American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF) has been a vigorous and detailed proponent of this Exemption. AFBF submitted six detailed and sworn Declarations of Farmers in the Seventh Triennial and was both a proponent and responder in the Eighth. AFBF appreciates that the Office has now granted this Exemption to the full extent of what the Office sees as its authority. Farmers have found this Exemption highly beneficial in daily commerce, and AFBF and its members have relied on this Exemption in negotiations and dealings with equipment providers.

Thus AFBF strongly supports the Office's intention to recommend renewal, and (particularly since, as the Office notes, no oppositions were filed against renewal) urges, for reasons stated in the Petition and in aid of the necessary commercial activities cited in the Office's Proposed Rules, that the Office recommend renewal, and that renewal not be subject to any condition or qualification as might be urged as to this or any other item.
