## What Can I Do on the Copyright Office Website?

- Register your basic claim to copyright
- View and download Copyright Office publications
- Search online records of registrations and document recordations from 1978 forward

## To make the Copyright Office website work for you, select the following items:

- *Register a Copyright* to file a copyright registration for your work through the Copyright Office online system
- *Record a Document* to learn how to record a true and accurate copy of your copyright-related document that can be accepted by a court of law as authentic evidence of the original
- *Search Records* to locate records of registrations for books, music, art, movies, periodicals, and other works as well as recorded documents pertaining to copyright ownership
- *Learn about Statutory Licensing* to find out about the Licensing Division, which is responsible for administering the various statutory licenses and other similar provisions
- *Copyright Law of the United States* to read or download the law
- *Electronic Copyright Office* to watch a tutorial on online registration
- *Publications* to access forms, publications, and historical documents relating to copyright
- *Contact Us* to email questions about copyright or to request specific forms and circulars. Or call the Forms and Publications Hotline at (202) 707-9100 and leave a recorded request for specific publications. The items you request will be mailed to you.
