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

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

What You Need to Know about Title I



- Establishes a mechanical licensing collective or "MLC" to administer the rights of copyright owners in their musical recordings under that license, and maintains a publicly available music catalog.
- Provides a right for copyright owners to opt out of the MLC.
- Provides a right for copyright owners to make their copyrighted works available online after a holding period.

Unclaimed Royalties

UNCLAIMED ROYALTIES STUDY

As directed by the MMA, the U.S. Copyright Office is undertaking a public study to determine the best practices that the Mechanical Licensing Collective may implement to effectively identify copyright owners and unclaimed royalties

BIM	Bureau International des Sociétés Gérant les Droits d'Auteur et de la Protection de la Reproduction Mécanique (International Bureau of the Authors' Rights)	An international organization representing mechanical rights societies. Negotiates licensing agreements with IFPI, assists in technical and administrative issues, and provides a forum for members to share information and discuss issues that may arise between individual members, and contributes to the defense of the rights of authors.
BMI	Broadcast Music, Inc.	All US nonprofit performing rights organization (PRO) that provides public performance licenses for musical works. Subject to a consent decree.
CIS	Common Information System	Common information system that uses a variety of international standard (ISO) and industry standard formats to exchange data. CIS members hold IPR (IP), sound work and databases (DSM, IS, PI, HY). Its index, Administered by CIS, is the largest and most complete source of music information exchange. Launched by CISAC, and used by all CISAC members.
CIS Net	Common Information System Network	A network of databases for the use of CISAC members built upon the CIS system.
CISAC	International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers	Worldwide association of authors' societies, representing more than 200,000 authors and publishers from 110 countries and geographical areas and all artistic disciplines (including musical composition, literary creation, plastic arts, fine arts, photography, film, television, and the performing arts). CISAC is the umbrella organization of national societies of authors and composers (the FIMC, ISAN, and IAP) and approves identifiers of any CISAC CS system.
CMO	Collective Management Organization	CMSA collectively licenses the use of rights they manage and collects and distributes royalties to its members. CMSA is a non-profit, non-governmental organization that represents mechanical rights societies, music licensing companies (e.g., a neighboring organization), and record companies, from the United States and outside of the United States.
CRB/CBS	Copyright Royalty Board / Copyright Board of Canada	Three judge panel that makes determinations and adjustments of fees for the use of copyrighted material by permission for the US Library Committee and for the Copyright Office.

effectively identify copyright owners and unclaimed royalties of musical works while encouraging copyright owners to claim royalties and ultimately reduce the occurrence of unclaimed royalties. To provide an educational foundation and facilitate public discussion on issues relevant to the study, the Office held an all-day symposium on December 6.
