EAGLECONDEV.COM POLICY REGARDING NOTIFICATIONS OF CLAIMED COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT

Upon notification to EAGLECONDEV.COM of a claimed copyright infringement as described below, EAGLECONDEV.COM will respond expeditiously to remove, or disable access to, the material that is claimed to be infringing or to be the subject of infringing activity pursuant to the following terms and conditions:

1. **Designated Agent.** The EAGLECONDEV.COM designated agent to receive notifications of claimed copyright infringement is: Bill Paone, Eagle Consulting & Development, 135 Kinnelon Road, Suite 204, Kinnelon, New Jersey 07405, 973-838-5006, bpaone@eaglecondev.com, Attention: EAGLECONDEV.COM/4104 Notice.

2. **Notice of Claimed Infringement.** All notices of claimed copyright infringement must be in writing and sent to the EAGLECONDEV.COM designated agent. The Notice of claimed infringement **MUST** contain the following pursuant to the Digital Millennium Copyright Act:

--A physical or electronic signature of a person authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed; and

--Identification of the copyrighted work claimed to have been infringed, or a list of multiple copyrighted works claimed to have been infringed; and

--Identification of the material that is claimed to be infringing and that is to be removed, and information reasonably sufficient to permit EsayNews to locate the material;

--Information reasonably sufficient to permit EAGLECONDEV.COM to contact the complaining party, including name, address, telephone number and electronic mail address.

--A statement that the complaining party has a good faith belief that the material in the manner complained of is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.

--A statement that the information in the notification is accurate, and under penalty of perjury, that the complaining party is authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.

3. **Misrepresentations.** Any person who knowingly materially misrepresents that material or an activity is infringing or that material or activity was removed or disabled by mistake or misidentification, shall be liable to EAGLECONDEV.COM for any damages, including costs and attorneys' fee, incurred by EAGLECONDEV.COM in removing or disabling access to the material or activity claimed to be infringing, or in replacing the removed material or ceasing to disable access to it.

4. **Termination of Subscriber's/Account Holder's/User's Account.** In the event a subscriber, user, or account holder of EAGLECONDEV.COM uses or posts infringing material or conducts an infringing activity, and if EAGLECONDEV.COM has direct knowledge of said infringing material or activity, it is the policy of EAGLECONDEV.COM that it may terminate the infringing content provider's or user's account so long as such termination does not interfere with "standard technical measures" as defined under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE
DIGITAL MILENNIUM COPYRIGHT ACT
NOTICE PROVISIONS**

Digital Millennium Copyright Act, P.L. 105-304, October 28, 1998

This federal law protects Web developers, content providers, and ISP's against claims that a web site contains material that infringes on the copyrights of third parties. The procedures outlined in the law and in these instructions provide a way for web-based business to avoid costly lawsuits for copyright infringement.

Anyone who claims that a web site contains infringing material or content, must comply with this Act, but only if the web based business has instituted the procedures outlined in the Act.

The Act requires the web site to post a DMCA policy in the form attached hereto. Then the web site must register an agent for notice with the copyright office as set forth on the attached forms.

STEP ONE:

Please fill in the information noted in the file called **DMCA.COPRY.POLICY.DOC**. (This is the form that goes on your web site to let people know the procedure they must follow if they wish to claim an infringement.) E-mail it back to me and I will post a PDF version of this form on your web site.

STEP TWO:

Prepare the letter entitled **copyright_ltr.doc**. All you have to do is fill in the name of an officer of the company (I guessed it would be Bill or Steve but it doesn't have to be). Then fill in their title and the date and have them sign it.

STEP THREE:

Next prepare the document that will be attached to the letter and mailed to the copyright office. The document is called **InterimDesignationofAgent.doc**. All it needs is the name and signature of the same officer of the company who signed the letter.

STEP FOUR:

Create a check for \$20.00 made out to the US Copyright Office and mail it, along with the letter and the Interim Designation of Agent document. Enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope. They will send you a document back that proves you registered with them and creates the protection afforded by the Digital Millennium Copyright Act.

CLAIMS OF INFRINGEMENT.

If you receive a notice from anyone about an alleged copyright infringement on your web site, the notice **MUST** comply with the information required in **DMCA.COPRY.POLICY.DOC** (the form we will post on your web site). You can require the claimant to redraft the notice to be in compliance with that document.

NOTICE: Copyright Infringement is a serious civil and criminal offense. You should take all claims seriously and remove any infringing material from your website. You should also seek the advice of an attorney who specializes in copyright or internet law.
